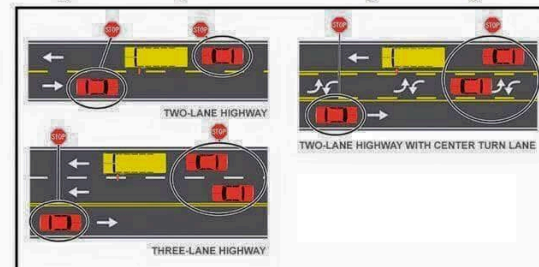

MESSAGE FROM POLICE FIRE AND EMS

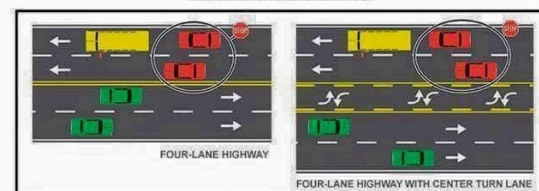
The Law, Bus Safety and You School resumes today for New Richmond students following winter break. To ensure student and motorist safety when driving around school buses that are picking up or dropping off, it's important to understand the laws.

Learn more with a helpful fact sheet that explains common driving situations. Don't put kids at risk - get the facts.

On a road with fewer than four lanes, all traffic approaching a stopped school bus from either direction must stop at least 10 feet from the front or rear of the bus and remain stopped until the bus begins to move or the bus driver signals motorists to proceed.



If the bus is stopped on a street with four or more lanes, only traffic proceeding in the same direction as the bus must stop.
