BUSINESS OF THE MONTH

New Richmond Public Library

The New Richmond branch library is part of the ten branch Clermont County Public Library system (our website is clermontlibrary.org).

New Richmond was a stop on the Library's bookmobile route in the 60s and 70s and has had a permanent location in New Richmond since 1980, when a no longer used bookmobile was towed into the village and opened as the library in the vacant parking lot of the New Richmond school (Storytimes were held outside under a tree or in an old classroom).

The library has also been in a former bar and the old school building, and then after the 1997 flood the new building was built where we are now at 103 River Valley Blvd.

The New Richmond Library has a staff of 6 - Amy the branch manager, Gina the Adult programmer, Chantelle the Children's programmer, and Eric, Jody, and Kathy the Library Assistant Specialists. The two longest employed staff are Amy, who has worked for Clermont County Public Library for 27 years and has been the branch manager of New Richmond since 2008 and Kathy who has worked at the New Richmond Branch for over 20 years!

Our busiest day of the week varies based on the season and if we have programs! The day we are open the longest is Monday when the library is open from 10 am to 8 pm. The rest of the week the Library is open Tuesday, 12 noon - 8 pm; Wednesday and Thursday 10 am to 6 pm; Friday and Saturday 9 am - 5 pm; the library is closed on Sunday.

Of course the library has books for all ages in both regular print and large print - but we have so much more! We have Pocket WIFI (unlimited WiFi you can borrow for a week), DVDs, BluRays, Music CDs, Audiobooks on CD and MP3 players, Video players, tablets, Storytime in a bag, STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math) kits. We offer eBooks, eAudiobooks, magazines, music, and streaming movies that you can download or stream on a phone, computer, or tablet. We offer photocopying, faxing, scanning, and printing services along with free computers and free WiFi in the building or our parking lot. We offer free Notary services (please call and make sure the Notary is in) at the New Richmond branch and many of our other branches. Some of our branches have 3-D printers and all of us may have them in the future. The New Richmond branch often has a jigsaw puzzle out that anyone can do and we have a puzzles that you can take home and do too (you can bring in puzzles that you have finished too).

We offer programs for all ages - we have storytimes both in person and an evening Zoom (online) for toddlers and preschoolers. We offer school age programs - once a month we do Homeschool Hangouts during the school year and we offer after school programs as well - Lego Club, Solar Science, and so much more. We regularly offer teen programs - we just had a decorate a journal or make a vision board. For adults we have Musical Monday Mornings - in depth look at a Musical or Musician and sing some of the songs with an accompanist; Make a

Radio show with us (April 1st is the next one); craft programs like an upcoming Spring Vision Board program and so much more. We also offer programs specifically for adults with Developmental Disabilities - coming up in March is Spring Bingo. The library is preparing for the eclipse! We will have three Solar Science programs for families - March 14th at 11 am, March 25th at 11 am (first day of Spring Break!) or March 25th at 3 pm. There are other Eclipse programs happening at other branches before the eclipse and two branches are having Open Houses during the Eclipse on April 8th. Also, all ten branches will be giving away (a limited supply) of eclipse glasses beginning on Saturday, March 23rd at 9 am (first come, first served).

All of us at the New Richmond Branch Library would be happy to help you find your next favorite book, tv show, movie, or program! We hope you come and check us out!
