



**Address:** 125 George Street (Ross Gowdy House)

**Date Constructed:** 1850

**Date Designated:** 11-14-2006

**Building Information:** 125 George Street is known as the Ross-Gowdy House and serves as the home to Historic New Richmond Inc. The Ross-Gowdy House operates as The Village of New Richmond's museum. The building is one of only two structures within the Village on the *National Register of Historic Places*.

The house was owned by David Ross and Thomas Gowdy who were both prominent business owners. David Ross served four terms as a Village Trustee. Thomas Gowdy was the Village Recorder, Trustee and the Secretary of the New Richmond Board of Education.

The building was originally rehabbed in 1970. Significant repairs were conducted by Historic New Richmond Inc. in 2005 thru 2007. The building was awarded two State of Ohio, Certified Local Government (CLG) grants to repair windows on the front and side facades.

The Ross Gowdy House is included on the Ohio Historic Inventory (CLE-40-10).
