Building Information: The 2 story building was constructed circa 1880 by J.D.F. Zumvorde. The building operated as a grocery and dry goods store for many years by Mr. Zumvorde. Following Mr. Zumvorde's death in 1919 the building continued to operate as a dry goods store for the residents of New Richmond. In the late 1950's A.P. Appliances began operation in the building and continued until 2007.

Architecturally, the building includes one of only three cast iron storefronts in the village. 310 Washington Street's cast iron store front was manufactured by Schreiber and Sons from Cincinnati. Second floor windows are 2/2 with bracketed lintels. The building was constructed to fit the irregularly shaped lot.

The building is currently vacant. In 1980 the building was included on the Ohio Historic Inventory (#CLE-472-10).
