



**Address:** 411 Walnut Street

**Date Constructed:** 1876

**Date Designated:** February 10<sup>th</sup>, 2009

**Building Information:** The 2 ½ story building was constructed for \$7,000 by German Immigrants to serve a Protestant congregation organized in 1848. The Church's original name was "Deutsche Protestant Ische St. Paulus Kirche" which is still inscribed above the front door. The Clermont County History describes the building as follows: *The house is 40 by 75 feet, of bricks, presents a fine appearance, and interiorly is handsomely finished*".

Architecturally, the building includes stained glass windows; front windows have gothic pointed arches. Although the spire is no longer present the original bell still hangs in the tower. Structurally the building includes original hand hewn bricks and plank floors.

The building is currently being utilized as a private residence and art studio. In 1980 the building was included on the Ohio Historic Inventory (#CLE-469-10).
