Sewer Expansion Project:

The projects are winding down in the three neighborhoods being serviced by the new low pressure system. With the arrival of better weather, residents are getting connected in greater numbers. Approximately 85% of eligible residents are connecting. The village sent out a letter outlining tap fee payment options and last call for connections.

World War I Commemoration:

2017 is the 100th anniversary of United States entry into WWI. New Richmond veterans are organizing a commemorative event at the Veteran's Memorial on Susanna Way for next Thursday April 6th at 7pm. There is a memorial plaque at the monument listing area veterans that served in WWI with a star next to the names of those that lost their lives in the conflict.

Sale of Village Property:

The village has received the surveys of the Plum Street and Water Street properties. The next step will be to have an appraisal done.
