Personnel & Finance Committee Report from meeting held 01-11-2021

Finance/Budget - Fiscal Officer Lynn Baird

- Requested approval of the 2021 HSA contributions of \$12,000 **
- Reported the following 2020 budget highlights:
 - o 48 new home permits
 - o CARES revenue in the amount of \$237,483.80
 - o BWC refunds in the amount of \$108,508.23
 - o Property taxes are down about \$60,000
 - o Income tax is up about \$5,700
 - o Mayor's Court revenue is down about \$7,000
 - o We did not have to do any Utility disconnects due to the BWC rebate but going forward that might change.
- The Personnel & Finance Committee reviewed all checks and electronic payments for the month of December 2020; we need a motion to pay these bills.***

<u>Village Administrator Greg Roberts</u> is in the preliminary phases of drafting a new ordinance that will cover the cost of policing the proliferation of new campgrounds. He has received some information from Sgt. Mallott, and he had the opportunity to have a brief conversation with the former Village Administrator of Yellow Springs, Ohio. Some communities charge a 3% lodging tax on transient rentals. The revenue covers various extra expenses, like increases in police and EMS/Fire services. If this would be approved, it would apply to not only RV camp residents, but bed & breakfasts, air B&Bs, and sleeping rooms. There are a number of things to consider, like how to collect the fees. But this is something we need to consider.

<u>Police Chief Mike Couch</u> reported the following:

- Chief Couch, Sgt. Mallott and Councilmember Mary Allen discussed changes to the golf cart ordinance; the fee amounts need to be finalized and the appropriate document updates made.
- A position for a full-time Officer has been posted; one of the officers is involved in a search with another police department.
- The Department had issues with the state-provided software resulting in time lost preparing reports and other duties.
- A discussion was held whether Village employees will be required to get the COVID-19 vaccination. At some point, Council will need to decide this.

Fire/EMS Chief Vince Bee requested the hiring of (1) Joshua Michael Hughes for the position of part-time firefighter/paramedic at a \$13.65 hourly rate of pay (2) Christian Lee Davis for the position of paid-per-call firefighter with a \$15 per

<u>Councilmember Prues</u> will meet with Frank of CT Consulting regarding a maintenance project that would involve removing/cleaning up debris from the river that continues to build up along our docks.

Police Chief Mike Couch reported the following:

- The officer involved in the December 2020 crash will return to work January 13, 2021 with no restrictions. We have learned this may be an uninsured motorists claim.
- Chief recommends a set fee related to golf carts of \$65
- Reported various crime data for the year 2020 including a 52% decrease in total crimes and a 386% increase in residential checks.
- Reported K-9 Officer Patriot was deployed 36 times year-to-date
