## Personnel & Finance Committee Report from meeting held 03-08-2021. Finance/Budget - Fiscal Officer Lynn Baird

- The 2019-2020 audit is in process. Because the Village has had really good previous results, the State chooses an independent audit form and allows for the use of a 3<sup>rd</sup> party independent audit firm. The cost for the two-year audit will be less than \$7000, compared to \$30,000 we have paid in the past.
- First half property taxes are expected at the end of March.
- Local income taxes appear to remain as expected.
- Public Entities Pool (PEP) insurance cost is \$52,117 vs. last year's cost of \$45,671. This all-inclusive policy covers items including Village liability, property insurance, police cruisers. Chief Couch noted the recent auto accidents involving our police cruisers, legal proceedings related to former Officer Henderson, and the speed cameras may have contributed to the
- Our Rumpke contract rate increased by 3% effective March 2021; rates will increase as well, as new homes are built.
- Our medical insurance renewal reflects a 12% increase. Currently we offer two plans: a traditional plan and a high deductible plan, with employees paying 25% and the Village 75% towards the cost of the premiums.
- The Personnel & Finance Committee reviewed all checks and electronic payments for the month of February 2021; we need a motion to pay these bills. \*

## Village Administrator Greg Roberts:

- Kathy Fuchs has been hired to replace Clerk of Council, Theresa Leigh.\*\*
- We have received a \$15,000. EPA grant for an electric vehicle charging station. We will be able to charge people for charging their vehicle.

- He and the Street Dept. are maintaining records related to the flood cleanup. The sewer plant survived the flood with only a few minor repairs needed. The Fire Dept. is cleaning up on Susanna Way and on other streets in the Village where needed.
- He will talk to the county prosecutor and commissioners to discuss what else can be done about our delinquent property taxes.

#### Police Chief Mike Couch:

- Working on filling the part-time position
- Scheduled extra officers to address increase in visitors during the flood.

#### Fire/EMS Chief Vince Bee:

- Sunesis Construction applied for a PUD which could result in 48 new homes to build out one of the unfinished phases of the Riverview Bluffs Subdivision located at the dead end of River Valley Blvd. A public hearing to discuss the proposed PUD will be held prior to the Planning Commission on April 1<sup>st</sup>.
- Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend Village Council accept the PUD application by HPA Development with the following conditions: 1) developer will construct a fence at the stub end of the main street at the property line of the adjoining property (2) The developer will work with the Village Administrator and others in conducting a traffic study of the Bethel-New Richmond Road corridor from Union Station to Regatta. A second public hearing will be scheduled and communicated by public notice and letters to adjoining property owners prior to Council voting on formal acceptance of the PUD application.
- Thanked Theresa Leigh for her service as our outgoing Clerk of Council and wished her the best. Please welcome Kathy Fuchs who has shadowed Theresa over the past couple weeks. Kathy comes to the Village with a wealth of municipal experience serving Wayne Township and Clermont County Municipal Court.
- I echo Mayor Ewing's comments in his letter in the March 4<sup>th</sup> edition of the Clermont Sun mentioning the current and pending additions to the New Richmond business community and encourage residents both old and new to "buy local" and support those businesses.

### **Police Chief Mike Couch**:

• Reported February year-to-date crime data including: a 38% decrease in total crime reports, a 22% increase in NRFD and NREMS assists, and a 1400% increase in business checks.

#### Fire/EMS Chief Vince Bee:
