Village Administrator Greg Roberts

- <u>Utility Billing Software:</u> With unprecedented growth with new housing, the current and future transition to radio-read water meters, the current utility billing software is insufficient for current and future needs. We have selected and will be transitioning to a new software provider that is a larger company with more to offer the residents in their billing.

- Movie Premier Christmas Collision: The film that started as An Unintentional Christmas premiered at RJ Cinemas Eastgate last Friday renamed as Christmas Collision. The village, as hometown New Richmond and several local businesses are featured in the film. It is a wholesome family film in the Hallmark
- <u>River Town Review Summit:</u> This Thursday at 9am the first Rivertown Review Summit will take place on-line virtually. Representatives from New Richmond, Augusta and West Point, Kentucky as well as Lawrenceburg and Aurora, Indiana will participate. The communities will share their results of participating in the reviews conducted with the Ohio River Recreational Trail organization and the National Park service aimed at enhancing tourism and outdoor recreation in Ohio River communities.

Police Chief Mike Couch

- There was a high speed chase today heading to Kentucky from Brown County involving domestic violence and abduction.
- The body cameras are set up on the cloud but are not in service yet.
- Kiante Gardner is expected to plead guilty to murder and will be receiving 25 years to life for the murder of resident Robert Farrell Jr.
- Patriot has allergies and is being treated for them.
- (*M3) During the wage discussions in July Police Officer Marc Heuer was missed. Chief Couch requested Police Officer Marc Heuer's part-time pay be increased from \$13.50 to \$15.00, which is the current new hire part-time rate. Councilwoman Allen approved the request but reminded Chief Couch that personnel issues need to be discussed at the Personnel & Finance Committee meeting before coming to Council.
- Mentioned a spike in drug activity in the 300 block of Susanna Way. Administrator Roberts: There is a Chronic Nuisance Ordinance which allows charges to be filed against property owners for the chronic criminal activity
