Councilman Feldkamp requested a status update on the non-conforming structure located on Front Street on the village side of Twelve Mile Creek.

Administrator Roberts reported that the owner has not responded to his and the Zoning Administrator's request to produce documentation that the structure qualifies as a recreational vehicle occupying one of the four conditionally approved campsites by the Planning Commission on that property. The owner informed Planning Commission at their October meeting that he and his family are now residing in the structure. At that time he was informed that village zoning requires dwellings to be constructed on permanent foundations and, if located in the floodplain, must be elevated above the base flood elevation. To Administrator Roberts' knowledge, no permits have been issued, or safety inspections performed, for the structure. Formal citations are in order if action by the owner towards compliance to zoning and/or floodplain regulations does not occur.
