COMMITTEE REPORTS

Personnel & Finance Committee report from the meeting held Monday, 12-13-2021 as reported by Committee Chair Mary Allen:

This provides a summary of the December 13, 2021 Personnel & Finance Committee Meeting. The meeting started at 4:35 p.m. and ended at 5:25 p.m.

Members present: Council Members: Gary Skeene, Richard Feldkamp, and Mary Allen, Committee Chair. Mayor Ewing. Police Chief Mike Couch, Police Sergeant Jason Mallott, EMS/Fire Chief Vince Bee, Assistant EMS/Fire Chief Tim Feldkamp, Village Administrator Greg Roberts, and Fiscal Officer Lynn Baird. Guests: Clerk of Council Kathy Fuchs. Employees: Ken Shearwood, Rob Painter. Residents: Ryan Woodruff and Dennis Dalton.

<u>Discussion Topics</u>: There were discussions in the normal four broad areas: Finance, Administration, Police Department, and the Fire & EMS Department.

Finance Committee - Fiscal Officer Lynn Baird

- 1. We had a high-level discussion on the Temporary Appropriations for 2022. Planned budget needs should be given to Lynn asap. This includes:
 - Any anticipated equipment or vehicle purchases, maintenance, repairs for 2022
 - Any expected grants or grant matches for 2022
- 2. Lynn provided some good news.
 - 2020 Dispatch fees payable in 2022 are \$12,000 under budget
 - Bureau of Worker's Compensation (BWC) premium was \$10,000 under budget (the true up to be paid in early 2022)
- 3. The Bonus Pay run total was \$48,803.77 (couldn't exceed \$57,976) will require an appropriation change
 - Grossman returned his money to the Village \$400
 - Amole wasn't initially scheduled to receive one, but he's going to receive the \$400 Grossman returned
- 4. Lynn advised that the State will not be doing the first responder's bonus this year.

(*M-2) The Committee has reviewed all checks and electronic payments for the month of November.

DEPARTMENT HEADS

Village Administrator Greg Roberts:

Administrator Roberts began by thanking Commissioner Painter for attending and performing the swearing-in of New Richmond's newest Councilmembers and then gave his report:

- Thanks & Welcome: Thanks to Gary, Becky, and Melanie for their service to the Village. Welcome to newly elected Council members Ryan, Dennis, Jon, and Mary. Assuming Council will choose to cancel the December 28th meeting per tradition, I wish all a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year
- (*M-7) Union Station Bonds: Earlier this fall our contract subdivision review engineering firm, Choice One, created a punch list for completion and acceptance of street and sidewalk work at Union Station. Over 80% of the punch list has been completed with only a few remaining. We currently have \$82,909.03 in combined bonds for Sections 3 & 4 of Union Station for street and sidewalk performance completion. I recommend, and Choice One concurs, that a request from the developer to release \$62,909.03 now and hold \$20,000 for the remaining few items to be completed be accepted as fair and reasonable. \$20,000 is more than sufficient to cover the costs of the costs if the items are not completed. I request a motion to release \$62,909.03 of the bond now and hold \$20,000 of the bond for the remaining few items to be completed at Union Station.
- Regatta: Section 1 is nearing completion. Sales for Section 2 will begin soon.
- <u>Tree City</u>: I commend, Clerk of Council Kathy Fuchs for her work on completing the Village's annual Tree City application. If accepted, 2021
