## Application to the Council of the Village of New Richmond, Ohio for the establishment of a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area, with specific boundaries, in the New Richmond Core Business District. Submitted February 11, 2020

#### I. Introduction

The Village of New Richmond Planning Commission respectfully submit the following application to the Village Mayor for presentation to Village Council of New Richmond, Ohio to approve and establish a Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (hereinafter "DORA"), pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("ORC") 4301.82.

A DORA is an area where the statutory open container restrictions do not apply at particular hours, and adults are permitted to possess and consume alcohol in an identified area, with certain restrictions. A DORA established within the Village of New Richmond would be the first DORA established in a village in Clermont County. The purpose of the DORA would be for economic betterment of businesses, residents, and property owners within the DORA, as well as the Village of New Richmond as a whole.

#### Section 1 — Boundaries

In accordance with the ORC 4301.82(B)(l)(b); ORC 4301.82(D)(b); and ORC 4301.82F(l)(a), the boundaries of the DORA are depicted on the following page. The area is bounded by the following:

- -The southwest boundary is Front Street right of way continuing to Susanna Way from Sycamore Street to right of way of Augusta Street.
- -The east boundary line proceeds up Augusta to Washington Street and heads west.
- -The west boundary line is the west right-of-way line of Sycamore Street commencing at its intersection with the Front Street moving north to the intersection of Willow Street.
- -The north boundary line commences at intersection of Sycamore and Willow and commences south along Willow right of way until the intersection of Union Street. The line commences along Union Street right of way until the intersection of Washington Street and commences east.

The specific boundaries of the DORA, including street addresses and a map of the proposed area are further depicted in Exhibit "A" and "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein. The DORA is approximately 33 acres.

## Section 2 - Nature and types of establishments located within the proposed DORA

In accordance with ORC 4301.82 (B)(2), the nature and types of establishments located within the Village of New Richmond Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) are as follows: Within the DORA, the majority of the buildings will have retail and restaurants on their first floor and there will also be residential, multi-family and single family.

## Section 4 - Area Impact

In accordance with ORC 4301.82 (B)(4), evidence that the uses of land within the DORA are in accord with the master zoning map of the Village of New Richmond, are as follows:


The uses of land within the proposed DORA are in accord with the Village's current master zoning map. All of the parcels within the DORA are currently zoned one of the following: B-1 Business; B-2 Business; R5-C Multifamily Residential Core; and/or R-3 Single Family Residential. Restaurants that serve alcohol, bars, and nightclubs (uses that would typically utilize a DORA license) are permitted uses in all of the aforementioned zoning districts.

The area of the DORA is envisioned as a mixed-use center of the community. The DORA designation complements this vision and will foster continued investment supporting the retail, restaurants, establishments, and residential uses contained within the DORA area. .

## Section 5 - Signage

In accordance with the ORC 4301.82 (B)(5) and ORC 4301.82 (F)(l)(b), the New Richmond Director of Public Safety & Service has determined there must be a minimum of 14 signs designating the boundary of the DORA. The locations and spacing of the signs are shown on attached Exhibit "C". The signs will be mounted and located at all street intersections along the boundary of the DORA. The content and style of this signage shall, in sum or substance, consist of the following:

### **Section 6 - Hours of Operation**

In accordance with ORC 4301.82 (B)(5) and ORC 4301.82 (F)(l)(c), the hours of operation for the DORA will be: Monday through Sunday, 12:00 p.m. (noon) to 10:00 p.m.

The applicant requests that Village Council reserve the right to temporarily suspend DORA operations for a period of up to seven (7) days in order to accommodate the permitting of special events that may occur within the boundaries of the DORA.

### Section 7 - Safety Plan

In accordance with ORC 4301.82 (B)(5) and ORC 4301.82 (F)(l)(d), a Safety Plan has been developed to ensure public safety in the DORA. A copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "D". The Safety Plan can be executed with existing staff.

#### **Section 8 - Sanitation Plan**

In accordance with ORC 4301.82 (B)(5) and ORC 4301.82 (F)(l)(d), a Sanitation Plan has been developed that will help maintain the appearance and public health of the area within the DORA. A copy is attached hereto as Exhibit "E". The Sanitation Plan can be executed with existing staff.

## Section 9 - Official DORA cup

In accordance with ORC 4301.82, beer, wine, and intoxicating liquor shall only be consumed within the DORA as follows:

Beer, wine, and intoxicating liquor shall only be served and consumed in the DORA in the plastic bottles or other specifically designated plastic containers produced and provided by the Village of New Richmond (the "Official DORA Cup"). The Official Cup will be distinctly marked with the DORA logo. No other container will be permitted. Used cups must be disposed of before entering any establishment of a qualified permit holder.





However, if changes to the cups are made, qualified permit holders will be given a 90-day notice of the change.

Official Cups will be produced and provided by the Village of New Richmond. Each qualified permit holder must order and purchase cups through the Village. The price per cup is to be determined.

## Section 10 - Additional Rules and Requirements

In accordance with ORC 4301.82 (B)(5), and in conjunction with other rules, standards and requirements set forth in this application, additional rules and requirements for the purpose of ensuring public safety and health within the DORA are as follows:

- A. A person may have in the person's possession an open container of beer, wine, or intoxicating liquor at an outdoor location within the DORA if the open container of beer, wine, or intoxicating liquor was purchased from a qualified permit holder to which both of the following apply:
  - 1. The permit holder's premises is located within the DORA; and
  - 2. The permit held by the permit holder has been issued an outdoor refreshment area designation by the division of liquor control.
- B. No person shall do any of the following:
  - 1. Enter the premises of an establishment of a qualified permit holder within the DORA while possessing an open container of beer, wine, or intoxicating liquor acquired elsewhere, or
  - 2. Possess an open container of beer, wine, or intoxicating liquor while being in or on a motor vehicle within the DORA, unless the possession is otherwise authorized under division (D) or (E) of ORC 4301.62.

#### Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) Security Plan

#### The Number of Personnel Needed to Ensure Public Safety in the DORA

The DORA's primary security force will be off-duty police officers (Outside Security) for private events and on-duty extra Village of New Richmond police officers specifically assigned to the DORA for Village of New Richmond sponsored and approved events. The Village commits to staffing, or requiring private events to staff special events at adequate security levels based on a risk analysis performed by the Village of New Richmond Police Department. Police officers working as outside security may not leave the DORA without supervisor permission. Their primary responsibility is to ensure the safety of people and property existing within the DORA. Their secondary responsibility is to enforce DORA regulations.

In addition, the New Richmond Police Department staffs a minimum of one (1) on-duty Police Officer to monitor the DORA as often as possible during DORA Hours of Operation as the *redundant* security force. This is not an open-ended commitment, and shall be tailored based on attendance, and risk to public safety, in an efficient, ongoing basis. These on-duty Village police officers' first responsibility is to respond to calls for service throughout the Village of New Richmond.

Finally, the Village will provide a minimum of one (1) marked Village of New Richmond Police vehicle for the on-duty Village Officers' use while in the DORA.

This Security Plan will be reviewed continuously, and may be updated at any time, but only with Village approval to ensure public safety.

## **EXHIBIT E**

## Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA) Sanitation Plan

## Requirements for Ensuring Public Health and Safety within the DORA

The Village of New Richmond Public Works Department will be responsible for maintaining the appearance and public health within the DORA. The Village of New Richmond currently has multiple permanent trash receptacles placed along Front Street and Susanna Way. The trash receptacles will be serviced by the Village's waste and recycling contractor once per week. Additional collections will be done on an as-needed basis. The Village's Public Works Department will monitor the receptacles and coordinate additional collections if needed.

For planned events in the DORA that may draw larger than normal attendance, portable restroom facilities shall be required at a central location within the DORA at the expense of the event organizer. Businesses with liquor permits within the DORA that are participating will be encouraged to allow general public access to their restroom facilities during the hours DORA is in effect.
