ORDINANCE 2020-06

VILLAGE OF NEW RICHMOND, OHIO

Council for the Village of New Richmond, Ohio met in regular session this $\frac{23}{43}$ day of $\frac{1}{200}$, 2020.

Councilperson Skeepe moved for adoption of the following:

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF VILLAGE EQUIPMENT

WHEREAS: Pursuant to sections 721.01 and 721.15(B) of the Ohio Revised Code, the Village of New Richmond has determined that the 2006 Ford Super Duty Truck (VIN #1FDXF47P66EB82415) which has an estimated value of \$1,000 or more, is no longer needed for municipal purposes, and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: The Village of New Richmond has determined that it would be in the best interest of the Village to sell the aforementioned Ford Truck (VIN #1FDXF47P66EB82415) to the highest and best bidder; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>: Pursuant to sections 721.01 and 721.15(B) of the Ohio Revised Code, selling the aforementioned Ford Truck (VIN #1FDXF47P66EB82415) required the Village to advertise the sale for not less than two nor more than four consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in order to make a written contract with the highest and best bidder for an amount not less than \$6,000.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of New Richmond, State of Ohio with a majority of the members concurring:

- 1. Does hereby instruct the Council Clerk to advertise the sale of the 2006 Ford Truck (VIN #1FDXF47P66EB82415) for a minimum bid of \$6,000 in a newspaper of general circulation for not less than two nor more than four consecutive weeks.
- 2. Does hereby authorize the Village Administrator to advertise for sale of the 2006 Ford Truck for a minimum bid of \$6,000 and to make a written contract for the sale of the aforementioned Ford Truck (VIN #1FDXF47P66EB82415) to the highest and best bidder.
- 3. Does hereby authorize the Village Administrator to right to reject any and all bids.
- 4. That Council finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the passage of this ordinance were taken in an open meeting and that all deliberations of Council which resulted in the passage of the Ordinance were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
- 5. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, safety and general welfare of the people of this the Village of New Richmond. That the Village by a three-fourths majority vote hereby dispensed with the requirement that this Ordinance be read on three separate days and hereby authorizes the adoption of the Ordinance upon its first reading.
- 6. That this Ordinance shall take effect at the earliest date provided by law.
